

DSUMF Executive Director: Lucille Sterling

Lucille Sterling began her full-time employment with the Foundation when she was hired as the Foundation's first, full-time Controller in June 2001. Previous to Lucille's service as Controller, an outsourced bookkeeping service was used to account for its funds.

Lucille was born and raised in New Mexico. Before moving to the Phoenix-Metro area, Lucille served as the Cashier/Operations Officer at a locally owned bank in Gallup, NM. Later, Lucille served as the Executive Vice-President and Director of the Gallup-McKinley County Chamber of Commerce. In 1999 Lucille decided to pursue her educational goals on a full-time basis. During that time, she worked part-time as the Secretary to the Executive Director of the Desert Southwest United Methodist Foundation.

Lucille graduated Cum Laude from Arizona State University in May, 2001 with a B.S. in Accountancy. She is also a graduate of the New Mexico School of Banking from the Robert O. Anderson School of Business at the University of New Mexico.
