The Long Journey Scholarship for Immigrant and DACAdmented Students

The Desert Southwest Conference, in partnership with the Desert Southwest United Methodist Foundation, is taking applications for the **Long Journey Scholarship**. This scholarship program recognizes DACA / undocumented students who have demonstrated exceptional leadership potential, are active in their community and/or within their local United Methodist Church, and who are pursuing a higher education. The scholarships assist students with the common financial challenge that they face while attending school. Multiple scholarships up to \$1,000 may be awarded annually.

Qualified applicants must submit an application, a response to essay questions, an official transcript, and two (2) letters of recommendation prior to the June 30th or December 31st deadlines.

All scholars and applicants shall be notified of the award decision within 60 days of the application deadline. Scholarship funds shall be paid directly to their school, for the benefit of the scholars. The scholarship amounts may vary annually relative to the funds available.

You may waive this right for faculty and staff when you ask them to write a letter of recommendation for this scholarship application process. It is your responsibility to provide this consent and to follow the appropriate protocol of your school.
